ANNUAL MPETA AWARDS

Each year MPETA presents a number of awards to recognize outstanding contributions to physical education in the province of Manitoba. MPETA believes it is a priority to recognize excellence in the field by honouring these distinguished individuals and organizations for their significant achievements in the **2008-2009 School Year**.

NOMINATION PROCESS

- All MPETA awards are presented annually at the **MPETA AWARDS EVENING** and/or SAG Conference.
- The nominee must be a current member of MPETA (excluding the Coalition, the Builder, the Andy Power Leadership and the Golden Apple Awards).
- Candidates can only be nominated for 1 award annually. A nominator may only nominate 1 candidate in each category.
- All questions must be answered in full and submitted with this nomination form.
- The due date for Award nomination submissions is September 11, 2009.
- Nominations are assessed by an impartial awards committee.

DESCRIPTION

CRITERIA

*Submit the following information on a separate sheet – point form is acceptable.

MPETA AWARD

This most prestigious award honours physical educators who have shown outstanding leadership and dedication to the promotion of physical education in the province of Manitoba. Each year the MPETA Award is presented to 3 outstanding physical educators; one in Early Years, one in Middle Years and one in Senior Years.

- Describe the candidate's philosophy of physical education.
- Describe the candidate's leadership in improving the health and well being of young people – by providing examples of the programs offered within the school (instructional, intramurals, inter-scholastics, clubs, special events...)
- Describe how the candidate has demonstrated significant contribution, support and commitment to the advancement of physical education in their division and the province over the course of their career via: committees, convenorships and presentations.
- Summarize the candidate's career as it pertains to this award.

INNOVATOR AWARD

This award is presented to a member of MPETA who has made a significant contribution to physical education by devising an innovative approach to instruction, by writing new curriculum material, by creating new devices or aids that improve the educational experience of students.

- Describe and/or submit the candidate's innovative approach that improves the educational experiences of students. (instructional approach, curriculum material/ device/aid...).
- Explain why the candidate's innovative approach to the field of physical education is both significant and unique.

OUTDOOR EDUCATION AWARD OF MERIT

This award is presented to an individual for their professional contribution in the promotion of outdoor education.

- Describe the candidate's leadership in developing an exemplary student program in outdoor education.
- Describe how the candidate has made a contribution to the advancement of outdoor pursuits as an important component of a quality physical education program (workshops, articles, presentations, leadership positions).
- Summarize the candidate's career in relation to this award.

STU SIEM AWARD

This award is presented to an urban and a rural school with an exemplary outdoor education program.

Provide an overview of the school outdoor education program including: program objective(s) and content, scheduling and number of students involved.

ANDY POWER AWARD

This award recognizes a Senior 4 student who has demonstrated outstanding leadership in outdoor education in their school or community.

- Describe the ways the candidate has demonstrated leadership during his/her Senior Years.
- Describe the abilities and characteristics that make the candidate an exemplary student leader.

NEW!!! GOLDEN APPLE AWARD

This Award will honour an outstanding school who has demonstrated a commitment in programming, resources and support of Healthy School initiatives/programs/events.

Describe the commitment to your Healthy School over the school year.

- List the initiatives/programs/events your school did.
- What was your most successful one? Describe it in detail including; how you did it; why your school participated; who participated and took the lead; what was the effect/result on your school/students/community?
- Identify any teacher health training or resources your school has supported over the school year.
